



British Milk Sheep were established during the 1970's in England. The breed are medium to large in size, polled, with white woolless faces and legs.

They are the most prolific breed in the United Kingdom with yearling litter size averaging 2.21, 2-year-olds at 2.63 and 3.07 in mature ewes. Easy lambing is generally reported in this breed with credit being given to an exceptionally large pelvic area. A milk yield of 650-900 L has been reported during a 300-day lactation. As a result of high milk yield triplets reared on the ewe average a weight gain of 0.33 kg/day. The milk solids is also particularly high. The protein content rises from about 5% in early lactation to 7.5% in late lactation, and the fat content changes from 5.5 to 9%.

British Milk Sheep produce a heavy, lean carcass. Fleece weights range from 4.0 kg in ewes and over 6.5 kg in rams. The demi-lustre wool have a spinning count of 50-54's with a staple length of 12 to 18 cm.
